PROV IV Hits the Road

The Province IV Altar Guild was organized in June 1987 and has weathered much change since then. I was going through some documents left to me by a former President and found the Province IV Altar Guild page you will see later. The second article in our Purpose Statement is "To bring into communion the altar guilds of Province IV...." In wondering what direction I should take to accomplish this, it became clear that we must grow our membership. I believe a good way to start this is to move our annual meetings throughout the Province so that more people can attend our conference. We have many fine Episcopal conference centers in our Province and we have a communication expert to support hybrid meetings via Zoom for those who choose not to travel. Looking ahead to the future, our annual meetings in 2025 and 2026 need a home.

For 2025 we are looking to Louisiana or Alabama as a meeting location. Sadly, the Gray Center in Mississippi is closed. I would welcome your suggestions for other sites within the Province. For 2026 we propose Kentucky or Tennessee. If you have a favorite venue in one of those states, please let me know so we can start the planning.

Province IV will not gather as a group in 2024. Our bylaws state we will support the General Convention and have a presence at the Triennial each time it meets. The next gathering of the General Convention is in 2024 in Louisville, KY. As your representative with the National Altar Guild, I will be sending information about this to you as soon as it is available to me. Wouldn't it be wonderful to have a large presence at the Triennial? It will be, after all, in our Province in 2024! In the years the Triennial isn't convening, the Province IV conference normally meets in the first week of June with registration on Sunday evening and departure after breakfast the following Wednesday. However, we would prefer to not coincide with ECW's annual meeting so that members of both can possibly attend both.

With the help of the twenty dioceses in our Province, I have begun to gather contact information for their larger churches. Some of you have received this newsletter as a result of this ongoing effort.

I would welcome any help you can give to support our purpose. I know that many dioceses have very active convocations or deaneries with the depth of knowledge to help us support the Province. Please let me hear from you.

ANNUAL PROVINCE IV ALTAR GUILD MEETING AT KANUGA Report by Kathy Shearer, PROV IV Secretary

The Province IV Altar Guild 26th Annual Meeting and Conference was held June 4th - 7th at Kanuga Conference Center, a pastoral setting in the mountains of Hendersonville, NC. The conference began with a Eucharist service in the Chapel of Transformation and ended with a final Eucharist service including the installation of officers and a blessing of hands. Each morning we had a prayer service in view of the white cross nestled in the woods overlooking the lake.

The theme of *Making Things New Again II*, was presented on Monday by our Chaplain, the Reverend Chip Broadfoot, rector of the Church of the Transformation in Saluda, North Carolina. Rev Chip opened with the comments that our altar guild vocabulary needs to change from use of the words such as "having a duty, completing tasks, and working" to "having a ministry". The altar guild ministry is a "godly mission for all of us." As we prepare the Lord's table it is a time of loving awareness, joy, and spiritual reflection, and when approached with a faithful heart, God is always there with us. "God makes all things new again."

Lively discussion ensued as we broke up into small groups to share experiences based upon questions Rev Chip asked us to discuss and then shared them with the entire group. Rev Chip asked, "Is God asking you to change in any way? Can we make our experiences serving on the altar guild more holy? Can our calling to serve empower us to help God make all things new again?" Rev Chip concluded that, "empowered by the Holy Spirit we can serve with faith, courage, and humility." and "we can become vessels and transform the world around us with one act of love at a time."

On Tuesday morning, Stuart Ibberson from Church of the Nativity in Dothan, Alabama, led the workshop *Subject to Change...Why do we need an Altar Guild Manual?* Stuart emphasized that a manual is essential for educating, training, and performance of our responsibilities for the altar guild in each church. Each church has its own way of dealing with its duties and should have its own manual. He covered many aspects of a manual's construction and editing. He also emphasized that captioned pictures are worth a thousand words, and manual organization should include the regular, special and seasonal services. Programs such as Microsoft Word and Publisher are commonly used and can enable proofreading multiple times by different people. It is also important for at least one other person to have access to the files. And lastly, realize that your manual is an evolving document...it is subject to change...by your present priest or your new priest or your director/directress.

Tuesday afternoon, Cheryl Burgoon, from Church of the Nativity in Dothan, Alabama, led a Make and Take Workshop about linens and embroidery. Cheryl shared her love of sewing and embroidery which she nurtured making beautiful dresses for her five daughters. She has transferred that love to the creating of beautiful fair linens for her church, which she displayed for us. Cheryl shared the following tips regarding linens: If you create your own fair linens or credence linens, use medium linen available from Almy and a large spool of 100% cotton German thread available from JoAnn Fabrics. She advised to roll linens wrapped in acid-free tissue paper on hard rolls and store them in individual 100% cotton muslin bags. For the final portion of Cheryl's workshop, she provided a complete kit for each of us to embroider a shadow cross similar to the ones she had embroidered on one of the fair linens she made in memory of her daughter, which she displayed for us. The attendees, women and men, enjoyed creating a beautiful cross which they could take home.

During the conference we also had time to chat and share stories at the welcoming reception, at mealtimes, and at the annual ice cream social. The Province VI Annual Conference is open to all altar guild members and is a wonderful opportunity to meet and share experiences with other altar guild members, to attend educational presentations, and to be inspired about our ministry.

However, my epiphany was to donate these linens to the beautiful people who provide this ministry. I donated the first lot and they were very grateful. They usually use old wedding gowns. How precious is that?! How precious to use linens that were used in communion with God!

I hope you, too, will find an organization like this for your deconsecrated linens!



PROVINCE IV ALTAR GUILD ANNUAL MEETING KANUGA INN AND CONFERENCE CENTER MONDAY, JUNE 5, 2023

In the absence of President Martha Noble, the 26th annual meeting was called to order at 1:24 by Vice-President Dianne Walters.

All participants had received a copy of the minutes of the 2022 meeting. Lynn Hendricks moved the minutes be approved as presented, the motion was seconded by Cheryl Burgoon. The minutes were approved unanimously.

All participants had received a copy of the 2022 Treasurer's report. Phyllis Bruce reported that we owed Kanuga additional funds to clear our bill in 2022. She considers it a measure of Kanuga's policy of charging for services rendered, and long overdue. The NAGA fund for the travel of the President was increased from \$2,000 to \$3,500 following a review of historical documents that stated \$250 of a SYNOD subsidy would be placed in the NAGA Fund. The NAGA fund was not reflecting the increases. There was some discussion about the purpose of the Betty Knowlton fund and no clear understanding of how it was to be used. Betty Knowlton was the first Treasurer of PROV IV. Phyllis stated she has several boxes of files from Ann McCormick and will see if they shed some light. Rebecca Taylor moved the Treasurer's report be accepted; motion seconded by Cheryl Burgoon. The Treasurer's report was approved and will be filed for audit.

OLD BUSINESS

There was wide acceptance by voting members, of moving the 2023 meeting to another location, possibly in north Alabama. After researching the viability of moving to another location within the province, the board agreed that Kanuga was the most reasonable in cost and accessibility at this time.

We were reminded that the Triennial meeting will be in Louisville, KY in 2024. Per the by-laws, PROV IV Altar Guild does not meet in the same year. Instead, we focus on attending the Triennial and will urge all our members to do the same.

NEW BUSINESS

As the host province for the Triennial, members of PROV IV Altar Guild will be called to help the local churches in any way possible.

In 2025, we will try to not meet the same week as ECW so that members who are in both can attend both. With two years to plan we may be able to find a suitable location other than Kanuga. A forthcoming newsletter will request help from the membership to find a location.

Members present voted to give our love offering in 2023 to the Pop-up Pantry, an outreach of the Church of the Transformation.

Lynn Hendricks represented the Nominating Committee, also composed of Dianne Walters and Peggy Curlin. She presented the proposed slate of officers which had been submitted to the membership in the fall newsletter as required by the bylaws. Phyllis Bruce for President, Joyce Edwards for Vice-President, Jay Walters for Treasurer, and Kathy Shearer for Secretary for the years 2024 thru 2026. There were no nominations from the floor and those present voted unanimously for the slate.

Vice-President Dianne Walters adjourned the meeting at 2:00 p.m. Respectfully submitted by Phyllis Bruce from the recording.
